

SUPREME COURT OF LOUISIANA

ORDER

Acting in accordance with Article V, Sections 1 and 5 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, Title XXXIII of the Louisiana Code of Criminal Procedure, Articles 941, *et seq.*, and considering the need to terminate the emergency order authorizing the Orleans Parish Criminal District Court to hold emergency sessions of court at alternate locations and suspending prescription in criminal proceedings in Orleans Parish due to Hurricane Gustav,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT:

Part 1. Due to the cessation of the emergency caused by Hurricane Gustav, the Orleans Parish Criminal District Court is no longer authorized to hold emergency sessions of court at the alternate locations set forth in the Order of this court dated September 5, 2008. This order shall not deprive the judges of Orleans Parish Criminal District Court of each of their offices as judge of the Orleans Parish Criminal District Court.

Part 2. Pursuant to C.Cr.P. Art. 955 and the cessation of the emergency caused by Hurricane Gustav, the Order of this court dated September 5, 2008, suspending time periods, limitations and delays in all criminal proceedings in Orleans Parish, is hereby terminated. The time periods, limitations and delays established by the provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure, Children's Code, Title 15, and Chapter 26 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 are reinstated in Orleans Parish.
