To urge and request judges of the State of Louisiana to dedicate the month of May 2014 to reaching out to schools to provide students with an opportunity to learn about the law, the role of a judge and the court system from members of the judiciary.

WHEREAS, May 1 is annually recognized as Law Day in the United States; and

WHEREAS, members of the judiciary and legal community across the nation traditionally mark the occasion by initiating and participating in educational programs designed to help elementary, middle and high school students understand our system of law; and

WHEREAS, the theme of Law Day 2014 is *American Democracy and the Rule of Law; Why Every Vote Matters*; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana District Judges Association has produced a handbook for judges entitled *Judges in the Classroom*, to provide a guide to assist judges in leading classroom discussions with middle and high school students; and

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Supreme Court Community Relations Department stands ready to provide judges with program support for outreach efforts to students and schools of all levels; and

WHEREAS, all judges have a unique ability to educate young people about our legal system and respect for the law;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Louisiana Supreme Court hereby urges and requests judges of the State of Louisiana to dedicate the month of May 2014 to reaching out to schools to provide students with an opportunity to learn about the law, the role of a judge and the court system firsthand from members of the judiciary.
