## EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY EMERGENCY *PRO BONO*CRIMINAL LEGAL ASSISTANCE RULE FOR ORLEANS PARISH

Acting in accordance with Article V, §§ 1 and 5 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, and the inherent power of this Court, and considering the request of the President of the Louisiana State Bar Association to continue in effect the Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish that was promulgated by this Court on June 23, 2006,

## IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT:

The Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish, which permits qualified non-admitted lawyers to provide temporary *pro bono* criminal legal services to indigent persons arrested or charged with a crime or crimes in Orleans Parish, at the request of the Orleans Parish Indigent Defender Board, be and is hereby continued in full force and effect for a period of one additional year. The Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish shall remain in full force and effect through June 15, 2008.
