Hughes, J., assigning reasons.

Respectfully, I would grant the writ application. Applicant was found guilty of contempt of court and sentenced to 30 days jail time <u>before</u> his scheduled hearing date on that issue, and <u>before</u> the judgment upon which the contempt was based was reduced to writing and signed by the trial court. Applicant had been ordered to execute a vehicle title conveying ownership (not interim use) <u>before</u> the merits of the partition action were heard. Applicant was ordered to pay attorney's fees, not authorized by La. R.S. 13:4611(d). Other procedural irregularities are alleged.

Criminal contempt of court must be strictly applied upon an unequivocal basis. Notice and due process are required.
