

SUPREME COURT OF LOUISIANA

ORDER

**LIMITED, RESTRICTED EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY EMERGENCY *PRO BONO*
CRIMINAL LEGAL ASSISTANCE RULE FOR ORLEANS PARISH**

Acting in accordance with Article V, §§ 1 and 5 of the Louisiana Constitution, and the inherent power of this Court, and considering the need to extend, in limited fashion, the Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish that was originally promulgated by this Court on June 23, 2006,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT:

The Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish be and is hereby continued in full force and effect as to the following listed out-of-state lawyers **only**:

- 1. Natalie Brocklebank;**
- 2. Anna Van Cleave;**
- 3. Paul Spyhalski; and**
- 4. Michael Kennedy**

As to these four lawyers only, the Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish shall be continued in full force and effect through 11:59 p.m. on June 15, 2008. On that date and time, any and all criminal legal assistance and representation of clients by these four non-admitted lawyers pursuant to the *pro bono* rule shall cease.

No other lawyers other than the four lawyers named in this Order shall be allowed to practice pursuant to the Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish. Furthermore, there shall be no further extensions of the Temporary Emergency *Pro Bono* Criminal Legal Assistance Rule for Orleans Parish.
